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Theatre Institute Students to Perform

On Wed. July 16 at 8 p.m. and again at 9:30 a.m. on Thurs. July 17, students from the Theatre Institute will perform the scenes and one short play that they have created and rehearsed throughout the institute.

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Tuesday Night Carillon Recitals

The Wingate Memorial Carillon Recital Series will present its third performer, Gordon Slater, on Tuesday, July 15. Slater held the position of Carillonneur at four Canadian carillons: the Rainbow Tower Carillon in Niagara Falls, Ontario; the Carlsberg Carillon of the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto; and the Soldiers' Tower Carillon of the University of Toronto before being appointed Dominion Carillonneur of Canada in 1977. He recently retired from that position after 31 years of service.

Slater has given numerous guest carillon recitals in Canada, the United States, England, Europe, Australia and New Zealand and has made several carillon recordings.

Slater's program will include a wide variety of selections from carillon originals to classical transcriptions to "Bridge Over Troubled Water" and "Take Me Out to the Ball Game".

All are invited to this free recital (7 to 8 p.m.).

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Children and Youth Learning Initiative Needs Field Days!

The Children & Youth Learning Initiative (CYLI) at Alfred University recently took a big step towards positively impacting local middle and high school students.

For the past four years, the CYLI has provided educational, after-school programs for local middle school students. These field days included, but were not limited to astronomy, Drawn to Diversity, chemistry, environmental science, theater, creative writing, and engineering. During this time the CYLI worked with a number of grants and foundations to provide three to four field days a semester.

Thanks to a collaborative partnership with the ACCORD Corp. and the Alfred 21st Century Community Learning Centers, the CYLI will receive \$335,000 over the next five years. These funds will be used to hire a full time coordinator and to significantly increase the number of field days provided (note there is a small faculty stipend for each field day as well).

Through this grant, the CYLI will be working with students from Bolivar-Richburg, Belfast, Canaseraga, Whitesville, Scio, and the Immaculate Conception (Wellsville) schools.

The CYLI currently receives funding from the Allegany County Division for youth, Foster Lake Club, and Rural Justice Institute. Past funders have included the Buffalo Bills Foundation, Jon Ben Snow Foundation, and Allegany County Area Foundation.

We are in the process of hiring a coordinator and whoever is hired will be contacting faculty and staff about possible field days, but we wanted to let you know about this exciting new development and ask that you think about possible field days that you may want to offer. Each "field day" is really usually only part of a day - either a few hours after school on a weekday or possibly a half day on Saturday. This is a great service learning opportunity for our students if they assist with field day activities as well.
