

## **AU alumnus to present Environmental Studies seminar**

Students in Alfred University's Environmental Studies program will hear alumnus James Saxton speak on "Protection of Wetlands: Balancing Public and Private Desires," Friday at 12:20 p.m. in Room 326 in the Science Center on the AU campus. His presentation is open to the public free of charge. Saxton, who earned his bachelor's degree from Alfred University in 1985 with a major in environmental studies and a master's degree in agronomy from Cornell University, is now with Barton and Loguidice, a consulting engineering firm based in Liverpool, NY. His presentation will address the history of wetlands protection, recent Supreme Court rulings regarding wetlands, and land uses associated with wetland protection. Saxton is a son of Irving Saxton of Cohocton and Georgia Saxton of Wayland.
