QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer and is a suicide prevention training that anyone can participate in. QPR is not a form of counseling or treatment. Participants completing the two-hour QPR Gatekeeper training will learn to:

- 1) Recognize the warning signs of suicide
- 2) Know how to offer hope
- 3) Know how to get help and save a life

The ultimate goal of QPR training is to prevent suicide attempts and completions and to find relief for those suffering from suicidal ideation.

The second in a series of four films and documentaries during the Spring semester the Institute for Cultural Unity will be sponsoring the showing and discussion of the documentary "The Loving Story" on Saturday February 15 from 7:00 pm - 9:30 pm in Nevins Theater in the Powell Campus Center on the Alfred University Campus. Admission is free and is open to the public.

"A racially-charged criminal trial and a heart-rending love story converge in this documentary about Richard and Mildred Loving, set during the turbulent Civil Rights era. Long Way Home: The Loving Story is a story of love and the struggle for dignity set against a backdrop of historic anti-miscegenation sentiments in the U.S. The Lovings, an interracial couple, fell in love and married at a critical time in American history, and, because of a confluence of social and political turmoil our reluctant heroes bring about change where previously no one else could. They are paired with two young and ambitious lawyers who are driven to pave the way for Civil Rights and social justice through an historic Supreme Court ruling, changing the country's story forever." Making Images Move: Handmade Cinema and the other Arts

Date: Tuesday, February 25

Dr. Gregory Zinman to lecture on handmade cinema

Alfred University's School of Art and Design will host a lecture by Dr. Gregory Zinman, assistant professor at Georgia Institute of Technology, who will speak at 5:30pm Tuesday, Feb. 25 in Holmes Auditorium, Harder Hall. Zinman's lecture will be drawn from his book *Making Images Move: Handmade Cinema and the Other Arts* (University of California Press, 2020).

Zinman's book provides a comprehensive survey of handmade cinema, from painted film and kinetic art to psychedelic light shows and video synthesis. The book reviews efforts by numerous artists to create moving abstraction by intervening in celluloid's physical makeup. Techniques include painting and scratching directly on the film strip; deteriorating film with seawater, dirt, or bleach; applying elements such as paper, glue, and even the artist's own blood.

Recovering a range of forms, tools, and intentions that, considered together, constitute a kind of shadow history of film, Zinman's talk will offer an overview of this approach to thinking about moving images. It's a radical alternative to the representational terms in which the medium is typically understood. While the goal of elevating or transcending abstract painting remains evident in many of the works to be screened, their diverging concerns extend into a variety of other arenas-feminism, social justice, self-portraiture, the Anthropocene-demonstrating the many ways that handmade cinema acts as counter-cinema, in concept, material, and execution.

Zinman's lecture is open to the public and free of charge. It is sponsored by Art History, Expanded Media, Sculptural/Dimension Studies and the Robert R. McComsey Career Development Center.
