The Alfred University Office of Student Activities was recognized for outstanding programming at the recent National Association of Campus Activities (NACA) East Coast Conference in Ocean City, MD. Alfred University's popular "Alfie Awards" was chosen as the NACA East Coast Outstanding Social Program. NACA East Coast, which includes more than 200 colleges and universities, presents four campus programming awards annually in the areas of diversity, social, educational and leadership. The "Alfies" are an annual awards show held to recognize student accomplishments and achievement, both as individuals and as groups. The awards show has an Oscar-like atmosphere: nominees, in evening dress, arrive by limo, disembarking onto red carpet with flashes popping. The show itself is replete with performers and all the glitz of its Hollywood counterpart. Last year's Alfie Awards saw 26 awards given out, based on voting by members of the Alfred University student body. The Alfred Awards are organized by the Alfie Academy, a group of students selected by the Office of Student Activities for their leadership, creativity and team spirit.
