Artist In Residence - Joseph Moore

Date: September 16-20
Location: The Institute for Electronic Arts

Joseph Moore is an artist whose conceptually based practice utilizes a variety of techniques and media, from photography to network-based art. His recent work investigates the place of the non-human within the context of photographic history as well as labor, temporality, and surveillance. He has exhibited in venues such as Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Tel Aviv, Israel; Microscope Gallery, Brooklyn, NY; WORM, Rotterdam, The Netherlands; Outlet Fine Art, Brooklyn, NY; Arebyte, London, England; and in collections such as The Rose Goldsen Archive of New Media Art at Cornell. He received his B.F.A. from The Atlanta College of Art and his M.F.A. from Bennington College.

During his residency at IEA Joseph Moore will create a series of print-based works that draw upon material from his long-term project "The Inhabitants." Began in 2014, "The Inhabitants" is an archive of 24-hour recordings made from poorly secured web cameras focused on non-human animals. Though this material Moore considers the place of the non-human animal both as subject and often as material in the history of photography and cinema as well as in current technologies of surveillance.

The Institute for Electronic Art's Experimental Projects Residency is made possible by the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the New York State Legislature.

Filmmaker/curator/professor Roger Beebe, who has been crisscrossing North America with his multi-projector performances and essayistic videos for more than a decade, comes to Alfred for the first time on Sept. 20. The program features new work, completed during his residency at the Headlands Center for the Arts earlier this year, alongside some of his best-known projector performances (including the six-projector show-stopping "Last Light of a Dying Star"). These works take on a range of strategies from formalist investigations of the materials of film to essayistic explorations of popular culture and a range of topics from Las Vegas suicides ("Money Changes Everything") to the secret logic of the book of Genesis ("Beginnings") and the real spaces of the virtual economy ("Amazonia").
